Workshop Aims

The rapid development of Information Technology (IT) has provided great potentials for improving the building and construction process as well as the built environment itself. To realise this potential, we need to equip new graduates and building professionals with the right IT skills through education and training. What to teach, when to teach and how to teach IT has become a hot discussion topic in many building and construction departments and faculties. In addition, the emergence of multimedia and on-line teaching and learning systems has changed the way teaching is delivered.

In recent years, more and more papers appeared on topics of teaching IT and teaching using IT in many construction IT conferences. Now we would like to move this question onto the stage. The aim of this workshop is to provide a dedicated forum for people with common interests in Construction Information Technology in Education.
